**Fiscal Impact Summary**

This Bill will have no impact on the General Fund or Federal Funds, but will have a minimal impact upon Other Funds utilized by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

**Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

**State Expenditure**

The bill provides that a law enforcement officer who suspects that a motor vehicle accident was the results of a driver's loss of consciousness due to a medical condition must notify the Department of Motor Vehicles of this determination and to provide that the Department shall promulgate regulations to implements this section.

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) expects minimal costs to implement this bill, which can be absorbed by their other operating funds. In 2014, DMV reports that 221 of over 200,000 accidents in 2014 were reported as loss of consciousness. This bill will increase those numbers, but the additional expenditures can be absorbed by the Department.
