Fiscal Impact Summary

The expenditure and revenue impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, and Federal Funds are pending, contingent upon a response from the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 10, 2017

State Expenditure

This bill prohibits the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) from assessing the \$5 per diem fine and the \$200 reinstatement fee relating to the lapse or termination of motor vehicle insurance that occurred while an individual was incarcerated. Currently, the per diem fine and reinstatement fee are not assessed if the lapse or termination occur as a result of military service or documented illness.

The expenditure impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, and Federal Funds is pending, contingent upon a response from DMV.

State Revenue

Revenue generated from the \$5 per diem fine and the \$200 reinstatement fee relating to the lapse or termination of motor vehicle insurance is credited to the State Highway Fund and distributed pursuant to Section 11-43-167.

The revenue impact on the State Highway Fund is pending, contingent upon a response from DMV.
