State Expenditure

This bill adds definitions to the South Carolina Pharmacy Practice Act and provides specific guidelines, health and safety standards, and procedures for compounding pharmacies and pharmacists regarding the preparation of compounded medications. The bill lists the current good pharmacy practices for the preparation and dispensing of compounded products, workplace safety, equipment maintenance, record-keeping, and consumer protection. The bill also provides public health standards for the compounding area environment and the handling of sterile preparations.

Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation. This bill revises standards for compounding pharmacies, which are regulated by the Board of Pharmacy. LLR is responsible for the administration of the Board of Pharmacy and reports that this bill places no additional regulatory duties on the board. Therefore, this bill will have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.

Department of Health and Environmental Control. This bill revises standards for compounding pharmacies. DHEC indicates that it does not operate any compounding pharmacies. Therefore, this bill will have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.
