Fiscal Impact Summary

The bill would increase General Fund expenditures for the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation by an undetermined amount for additional staff needed to perform these new duties.

This bill assigns responsibilities to the Board of Pharmacy administered by the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) that have historically been performed by the Department of Health and Environmental Control’s Drug Control Division (DHEC). If the bill is amended to allow the Department of Health and Environmental Control to retain these responsibilities, there would be no additional expenditure impact to the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill amends Section 44-53-160 relating to the manner in which changes to the controlled substances schedules are made. The bill provides that every ninety days the Board of Pharmacy, in consultation with the State Law Enforcement Division, shall provide a written report to the Governor, Attorney General and the General Assembly identifying new synthetic cannabinoids or cathinones with a high potential for abuse that should be added to the list of illegal controlled substances. The bill also provides that the Board of Pharmacy is authorized to adopt emergency rules regarding the placement of an identified synthetic drug on a controlled substance schedule.

This bill assigns responsibilities to the Board of Pharmacy administered by the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) that have historically been performed by the Department of Health and Environmental Control’s Drug Control Division (DHEC). If the bill is amended to

allow the Department of Health and Environmental Control to retain these responsibilities, there would be no additional expenditure impact on either agency.

Department of Health and Environmental Control. If the bill is amended to confer these additional duties on the Drug Control Division at DHEC, the department reports that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation. As drafted, the bill would increase General Fund expenditures for the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation for additional staff needed to perform these new duties by an undetermined amount. If the bill is amended to confer these additional duties on DHEC's Drug Control Division, LLR reports that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.
