Fiscal Impact Summary

The expenditure impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC).

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on February 27, 2018

State Expenditure

This bill establishes a new advisory council under DHEC. The council will consist of fifteen members. Members may not receive compensation, but are entitled to mileage, subsistence, and per diem. The council must meet at least four times per year.

Department of Health and Environmental Control. The expenditure impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC).

House of Representatives and Senate. This bill requires that two members of the newly created advisory council be appointed from the House of Representatives; one appointed by the House Speaker, and one by the House Minority Leader. In addition, two members must be appointed from the Senate; one appointed by the Senate President Pro Tempore and one by the Senate Minority Leader. The bill specifies that each council member is not entitled to compensation, except mileage, subsistence, and per diem as allowed by law. Each House and Senate member will receive per diem of \$35, subsistence of \$202.03, and mileage of \$0.54 per mile for each meeting on non-session days. These expenses will be managed within the budgets

of the appointees' respective legislative bodies. Therefore, the bill does not have an expenditure impact for the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds for the Senate or the House of Representatives.
