**Fiscal Impact Summary**

**Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

**State Expenditure**

This bill requires a Workers' Compensation Commission hearing to be in the district in which the injury occurred, but no greater than seventy-five miles from the county seat of the county in which the injury occurred. County seat is defined as the county courthouse. This bill updates the law to reflect the current practices of the Worker's Compensation Commission. Additionally, there is at least one venue available within each district that is within seventy-five miles of each county's seat. Therefore, there will be no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.
