Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill will have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds of the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) since any modifications to forms and changes in process can be managed within existing appropriations.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 8, 2019

State Expenditure

This bill allows DMV to issue a driver's license or an identification card with a veteran designation to an applicant who can provide one of three forms of proof. Currently, the applicant must provide a United States Department of Defense discharge certificate (DD Form 214) that shows a characterization of service or discharge status of honorable or general under honorable conditions and establishes the person's qualifying military service in the United States Armed Forces. However, the bill adds two other forms of proof an applicant may provide:

- a National Guard Bureau report of separation and record of service (NGB Form 22) that shows a characterization of service or discharge status of honorable or general under honorable conditions and establishes the person's qualifying military service in the United States Army and Air National Guard or
- a United States Department of Defense honorable discharge certificate (DD Form 256) that establishes the person's qualifying military service in the United States Army and Air National Guard or military Reserve.

DMV indicates that any modifications to current forms and changes in process can be managed within current appropriations. Therefore, the bill will have no expenditure impact on the agency.
