Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 24, 2017

State Expenditure

This bill allows a volunteer who provides transportation in their personal vehicle for a senior citizen to be liable only for damages for injury or loss to the senior citizen, the spouse, family member, or heirs and assigns, resulting from the volunteer transportation, to the extent of automobile insurance applicable to the vehicle involved in the collision. This limitation applies if: the volunteer was acting in good faith within the scope of their official duties, the injury was not caused by gross negligence or reckless disregard for the safety of the senior citizen, and the motor vehicle being driven by the volunteer is covered by the owner's insurance policy.


The bill also allows a volunteer to be reimbursed for the operating expenses associated with using their personal vehicle to provide transportation, based on the federal mileage rate. The volunteer must not receive any form of compensation for providing volunteer transportation.
