Fiscal Impact Summary

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) indicates that this bill will have no impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds since they are currently notifying individuals who are convicted of a crime of violence to surrender their driver's license or special identification card.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 9, 2018

State Expenditure

This bill requires DMV to notify an individual who is convicted of a crime of violence as defined in Section 16-1-60, instead of Section 16-23-10(3), that they must surrender their driver's license or special identification card to DMV by mail or in person.

DMV indicates that the agency is currently notifying individuals who are convicted of a crime of violence in Section 16-23-10(3) to surrender their driver's license or special identification card. Changing the reference to the definition of crime of violence from Section 16-23-10(3) to Section 16-1-60 will have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.
