The acts address the creation and use of powers of attorney authorizing an agent to act on behalf of the person executing the power regarding the person's private affairs (Uniform Power of Attorney Act) or health care decisions (Statutory Health Care Power of Attorney Act).

Explanation of Bill Filed on May 14, 2015**State Expenditure**

This bill adds Article 8 to Title 62 so as to enact the South Carolina Uniform Power of Attorney Act. The bill also defines applicable terms, outlines the Article's requirements and applicability, and provides exceptions. Finally, the bill amends Article 5, Title 62 so as to enact the South Carolina Statutory Health Care Power of Attorney Act and to define applicable terms and outline requirements and applicability.
