Local Expenditure

This bill reduces the minimum number of toilets and lavatories required for all middle and high school football stadiums built or renovated after the effective date of this legislation. The bill applies also to middle and high school football stadiums in existence or in the process of being planned, constructed, or renovated on the effective date of this legislation. A stadium that is being renovated and is not replacing existing seating or adding new seating is not required to add water closets or lavatories to conform to this bill, any other applicable building or plumbing codes, school building regulations, or another provision of law. For a stadium being renovated to

replace existing seating or add new seating, the plumbing fixture requirements apply only to the number of new seats being added or replaced.

With the reduced minimum number of toilets and lavatories required by this bill, we anticipate school districts' expenditures on renovations or new construction of middle and high school football stadiums will decrease by an undetermined amount. The amount of local school district savings from the reduced minimum number of toilets and lavatories is undetermined because information on the number of renovations and new construction along with the expected change in the number of seats in the stadiums is unknown.
